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About the workshop

A hands-on workshop on Team Based Learning (TBL) aims to delve into the notion of collaborative teaching and learning interfacing through the cultural environment. Culture is collective programming of the mind that distinguishes the members of one-group or category of people from that of another. The consideration for collaboration between individual differences based on culture is emphasized in the broad idea of collaborative learning. As a type of collaborative learning, Team-Based Learning (TBL) is a popular form of small group learning that uses a sequence of individual work, group work, and immediate feedback. It encourages active participation, as learners are required to complete pre-readings and be prepared to discuss cases in class. By the end of the workshop, participants will be able to Describe active, collaborative learning and deep approaches to learning, Examine how TBL incorporates principles of effective teaching and learning, Experience TBL as a learning approach.

The workshop commences on 9th May 2024 from 10am to 1pm at BITS PILANI, KK BIRLA Goa Campus. It will be delivered in three phases. Participants will be required to report to the venue on the 9th May at 9.30 am for registration. The first phase of the workshop will be for 2 days i.e. 9th and 10th May 2024 from 10 am to 1pm and will be delivered in hybrid mode .
